Our Uphill Journey

"...we all...are being transformed...
from one degree of glory to another.
But we have this treasure in jars of
clay, to show that the surpassing
power belongs to God and not to us."
2 Cor 3:18, 4:7

As we worship Christ, love Christ, serve Christ, and dwell in Christ's presence, the Spirit transforms us from one degree of glory to another. We have power in the Spirit to put to death the deeds of our sinful nature, and to live no longer as slaves. Instead, the Spirit enables us to live as beloved and adopted children of God. We call upon a holy and almighty God as Abba, Father. We are joint heirs of the coming kingdom of God, and partners with God in reconciling the world back to Him.

While we cannot earn so great a salvation, it requires daily Spiritempowered, grace-enabled effort to grow in Christlikeness. We engage in the practices of spiritual formation to abide in Christ, the true vine, and to allow the Father, the vinedresser, to make our roots run deep into the lifegiving water of God's love and grace. As we do, we bear abundant fruit for Christ and kingdom, and we experience the unstoppable love of the Trinity, which is always there, even in our worst moments.

Nonetheless, even as a born-anew, Spirit-filled, adopted child of God, our walk with Christ often remains an infuriating mixture of too much sinner and very little saint. Though we have moments of experiencing the indwelling Holy Spirit, more often than not, we feel stuck in our inescapable sinfulness.

This is because "we have this treasure in jars of clay." Hence, there will always be a gap between the promise of transformation and our experience of feeling transformed. God allows this tension of being both sinner and saint "to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us."

In our long, hard journey, we take comfort that Christ has promised to complete the work He has started in us, and that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Thus, our transformation into Christlikeness is a mysterious and frustrating mixture of guaranteed glorification and guaranteed struggle.

As Christina Rossetti describes in her poem *Uphill:*

Does the road wind uphill
all the way?
Yes, to the very end.
Will the day's journey take the
whole long day?
From morn to night, my friend.



GracePoint Worship: 10:30–11:40am



GLOBAL MISSIONS

Hamds in Lebanon

With a family of five and a ministry in Beirut, Lebanon, a lot is happening in the lives of Robert, Joyce, Ben, Joseph, and Lydia Hamd. Most of the activity centers on education.

- Robert finished his doctorate in missiology from Fuller and had an article published in the World Evangelical Alliance (WEA)
 Connections Magazine. The article focuses on the church participation in God's mission by working with the poor.
- ◆ Joyce continues to teach high school literature. Three months ago, Joyce was asked by a student to start a lunch-time Bible study. Even though the school is a private Christian school with the freedom to conduct a Bible study, more than 60% of the students are not from Christian backgrounds. Recently, a boy from a Muslim background began to attend the study of Philippians.

 Ben has graduated from George Washington University in Washington, D.C., with a degree in International Affairs from the Elliott School of International Affairs.

- Joseph continues his classical studies at St. John's College in Annapolis, MD.
- ◆ Lydia is finishing high school and making her college visits. She is very interested in Belmont University in Nashville, TN, and plans to earn a theater degree.

Rev. Hamd is pastor of a church plant that includes the Philemon Project, a ministry to migrant workers and refugees in need. In a recent newsletter, Hamd describes a need for child care in a poor suburb of Beirut. He tells about an unregistered daycare center where most of the 20 kids are often tied to chairs. There are no toys at all; the room is tiny, and it is extremely hot. The mothers of these children are mostly vulnerable migrant workers on very low salaries, who have no choice but to put their kids in daycare centers that resemble prisons.

Here is an excerpt from their newsletter, "hope4lebonan".

The Philemon Preschool Project, together with a broad base of concerned missionary women, under the auspices of the Arabic National Evangelical Church, has decided it's time to take action. We cannot ignore the plight of these children. That is why we are starting up a world class daycare center for about 80 children from the lowest economic strata.

We have already found the perfect location for the daycare in



Missional Donation Project Team Report

Your Project Team has been meeting on a regular basis to implement the Envisioning Team Proposal, which was approved by Session.

Considerable time has been devoted to the refinement of the general traffic flow patterns and space utilization. Sara has provided her expertise in interior design by looking at ways to carry the theme of angles from the sanctuary into the renovated space, as well as cuing good memories for those who enter. She has emphasized the importance of a visual line from the Coffee Café to the sanctuary doors, in order to catch newcomers and transition them toward worship in the Sanctuary. Her ideas are being incorporated into the final doorway positions.

The team has hired FEH Associates Architects to provide floor plan details and structural engineering drawings. The principle architect at FEH

is Kevin Eipperle, who worked on the 1990 building revisions and is very familiar with our building. The team has hired MEP Engineers to provide technical details for the heating, air conditioning, and electrical changes. These documents will be important to obtain accurate quotations for the work.



The Bell Equipment storage areas have been finalized, and construction of cabinets is ready to start. The detailed design for

the new storage area in the boiler room is underway, and building of the walls will begin soon. Once these two areas are complete, other closets will be emptied to make ready for their demolition.

Quotes for some of the early steps of renovation have been submitted. Once the architect drawings are finished, we will go out for contractor quotes for the major building changes.
