Faith: The Sin of Unbelief

Therefore, holy brothers and sisters, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus. . . . Take care, brothers and sisters, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. As it is said, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion." Hebrews 3:1,12-15

A foundational truth of our faith is that we are saved by faith alone, through grace alone, in Christ alone. Nevertheless, the New Testament never shrinks away from directly connecting faith to good works. The same faith and grace that saves you is the very same faith and grace that transforms and empowers you. It is impossible to have one without also having the other.

Thus our passage warns us, we remain part of God's people if indeed we hold fast our confidence. The author compares those who fall away from Christ to the Israelites who rebelled against God in the Wilderness, and so did not enter the Promised Land. This is the tragedy of choosing to live in the most horrific of all sin: the sin of unbelief! Don't be part of today's Wilderness Generation!

Piper warns, "All sins come from

unbelief in the promises of God." The deceitfulness of sin, and the root sin of unbelief, as Genesis 4:7 warns, is always "crouching at our door." Piper admonishes, "We must battle unbelief every day!" Our passage gives us two potent avenues for battling unbelief: Christian community and meditating on Christ.

You simply will not live in faith, and you will most certainly slip into the sin of unbelief, if you are not a faithful participant in a faith-filled community. Most of us are dangerously under-fellowshipped! Our passage calls for a *daily* meeting together.

The antidote to unbelief is faith. Our passage reveals that faith is the fruit of pondering daily the magnificence of Christ, and the matchless power of His blood. What do you do each day to meditate on the splendor of Christ? As John Owens instructs, "Set faith at work on Christ for the killing of your sin. His blood is the great sovereign remedy for sin-sick souls. Live in this, and you will die a conqueror; yea, you will, through the good providence of God, live to see your lust dead at your feet."

Exchanging Shame for Glory

Intensive Spiritual Formation Small Group

Come discover freedom and joy in Christ!

This is an invitation to participate in an intensive spiritual formation small group, designed to foster deep transformation in your soul by exchanging shame for a strengthened identity in Christ. If GracePoint truly desires to embrace a *Missional Soul Care Community* model, eventual participation for all in one of these groups will be essential, as shame is the strongest barrier in every soul to close relationships with God and others.

This group is open to any Christian in the tri-state area ages 18 and above. This soul care group is the fruit of 6 years of doctorate study, and fostered major healing and freedom in Christ for the participants of the first group. This will be a weekly small group that meets for ten, 2-hour sessions, and will also require 2 hours a week of activity outside of the group time.

Every person has deeply imbedded shame issues! Shame is the inner voice of *ever* feeling inadequate, unable, not good enough in any area, or unworthy. Shame is the root of why you either pull away from close relating or respond defensively or critically to another. Shame is the thief of why you do not always feel deep joy. Shame is the barrier to releasing your full giftedness, talents, and creativity. Shame is the fear that while God may forgive and love you, God couldn't possibly delight in you.

WHEN: There are two possibilities in 2018. Which dates are selected will depend on which of these two options works for at least 10 people, the minimum required to run this group.

January 9-March 13, every Tuesday for ten weeks, from 6:30-8:30pm.

April 3-March 29, every Tuesday for nine weeks, from 6:30-8:30pm.

Please fervently pray to discern if Christ is leading you to participate in this transformative experience, and then please let me know by December 15.



But in the midst of ministry, sometimes Christians are burdened beyond strength, despairing of life, having fears within, and conflicts without. How do we cope with those things? This book tells us how to be strong in the Lord when accusations and persecutions come; how to have confidence in Him and not lose heart.

GLOBAL MISSIONS UPDATE

In April's "Words of Grace" your Global Missions Team announced a new mission cause. Christian Aid Mission was the recipient of the special offering for Easter. Once more, GracePoint was able to reach out to the unchurched and unsaved around the world.

Christian Aid Mission is a world-wide organization that trains and sends local missionaries to plant churches where none currently exist. Christian Aid Mission provides financial support to indigenous ministries; they do not send Americans as resident missionaries. They help native ministries that are fully independent and work for Christ in their own countries, tribes, or language areas. Here is one of their stories.

PAKISTAN - In 2005, native missionaries led a group of people to Christ in a political region in Pakistan that is particularly hostile toward Christians. They faithfully worshiped the Lord in a makeshift tent for the next ten years, until gifts from Christian Aid Mission supporters made it possible for them to complete their very own church building in May 2015. For believers in this area of the world, a church building is a sign of stability, identity, and hope. This church is the first worship building ever built in this region in Pakistan. The building includes a baptistry where 100 people have already been baptized. "As I think of the future of this congregation, I have asked the Lord to give us 1,000 people to be baptized in the pool of this building," the ministry leader wrote. "It might sound a bit too much to some, but the Lord of the harvest is worthy to grant us much more than that. Would you please join with me in prayer to see this vision materialized?"



There are many other success stories like this one. For example, recently in Chad, Africa, church leaders from 22 evangelical denominations in Chad came together to establish a witness for Christ in each of Chad's 72 unreached Muslim people groups.

And we help support Sam and Elizabeth Schoofs as they minister in Chad. Indirectly, they (and we) are part of the efforts to reach the unreached with the Gospel of Christ.

Please keep all the missionaries who are a part of GracePoint's regular support in prayer as they live and work in places much less safe and comfortable than we do.

PLEASE NOTE: The financial books for GracePoint officially close on December 31st. Contributions received January 1st and on will be credited to 2018.

To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions, please do not file your income tax return until you have received written acknowledgment of your contributions from GracePoint. Any questions, contact Paulette Kress (556-6797).

Financially Speaking: Some members of our congregation regularly use numbered contribution envelopes. Others do not. Here are some reasons the Stewardship Committee recommends their use.

For you: You receive a statement of your giving two times a year at minimum. This is useful for tax purposes as well as a benchmark for your giving. An envelope is an easy reminder for giving on a regular basis. Just keep your stack of envelopes in a handy place for your check or cash every Sunday morning. You will feel good about the discipline of regular giving and be reminded of God's goodness to you.

For GracePoint: It is easier for your church to keep track of giving patterns and to plan a yearly budget. All contribution records are confidential. Only the financial secretary and you know. Using envelopes makes it much easier for us to acknowledge your contributions. It is the only way that cash gifts can be credited to you.

If you do not have numbered envelopes and would like them, please call the church office (583-3929) or the financial secretary, Paulette Kress (556-6797). As a bonus, you won't have to request them next year. You will automatically be issued some before January 1.


Check Out the Library


