"What are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor." Psalm 8:4-5 NRSV

t was into a culture immersed in the shaming categories of a legalistic, graceless

application of Old Covenant Law, and honor as worth bestowed by the community using standards that excluded the most vulnerable, that Jesus came and scandalously began to shatter these taboos and dividing walls. Much of the New Testament is to rewrite the Greek, Roman, and Jewish honor codes, and to replace them with the new honor

codes of God's Kingdom.

Christ's Sermon on the Mount is really Christ presenting the new honor codes of the Kingdom. Christ revealed that in the Kingdom of God the honor and shame categories are radically changed: The first become last, the least become great, the servant is the leader, the weak are strong, the poor are rich, children are blessed, women are equals, and outcasts are celebrated.

Because God has wired us to seek honor, you are motivated by what you believe will bring you the least amount of shame and the most amount of honor. If you are seeking honor and glory from the American society around you, you will most likely spend much of your time pursuing material possessions, physical attractiveness, prestige, and success in your career, because that is what our culture honors.

If instead you are seeking honor and

glory from God and for God by pursuing the values and lifestyle *God* considers honorable, you will live a God-pleasing life of kingdom-demonstrating faith, sin -overcoming hope, and other-serving love.

When you do, you live in the honor granted to you by the one whose court of opinion matters most, the Almighty

Triune God of all grace!

Christ purposely sought out those who were being

shamed or dishonored in their community, in a society where honor was the supreme value, to give them honor in God's Kingdom. Thus, if we want to participate in Christ's ministry, we must do the same.

Healthy living in Christ comes not from living in the pride of seeking honor and glory from the world, nor from living in the shame of feeling unworthy of honor and glory. Rather, in humility, we are to seek our honor and glory in bringing honor and glory to God. When we do, God turns around and bestows unimaginable honor and glory upon us, now and forever, as His royal family!

Praying the Holy Name of Jesus

Perhaps the most shattering consequence of Jesus' real presence, which is brought about by invoking his name, is that we become unable to lie to ourselves any more. He is light, and wherever he inserts his lordship there is now an absolute necessity of honesty and a zero tolerance for any form of self-deception, self-congratulation, or self-gratification, even those forms that felt necessary, natural, and almost innocent before. He is gentle, but he is light, and he simply does not and will not coexist with any darkness at all; either he casts it out, or it keeps him out.

This is the negative dimension of the fact that he is light. He subtracts our falsehoods. But he also adds his truth. The positive dimension is essentially a clarification of vision, of perspective, of the "big picture." He does not (usually) give specific directions or instant solutions, but he always gives a clarification of our vision. (This usually happens gradually.)

His presence manifests itself, not in fire or wind or thunder, but in a still, small voice. Only in this quietness does he give us the certainty of his presence. We usually cannot hear this because we are making so much inner noise, especially when we are agitated. But this is when he wants most to come, for he goes where the need is.

And what happens when we invoke him during our agitation? He answers! But not by magic or spectacle. Nothing spectacular happens when I invoke the Holy Name at times when I am reacting to my problems by the "fight-or-flight response" that is so natural to our animal nature (that is, either by the "fight" of inner rage and resentment or by the "flight" of self-pity and fantasizing). At such times, when I pray his name, I do not suddenly feel holy or happy, but I do suddenly feel . . . well, "mature" is the only word that comes to mind. The word from the Word is often something like "Grow up!" I suddenly see that far more *important* things are at stake than my feelings, when I let his great wave come in and wash my little garbage away. What had looked big on my beach looks tiny in his waves.

We do not always get specific answers, even when we invoke his name; but we always get the Answerer.

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Doctorate Presentation

The purpose of my doctorate is to design an intensive spiritual formation group and retreat. It will be designed to foster joy-giving, life-changing, who-you-are-in-Christ strengthening encounters with the Trinity. These intimate encounters will exchange any shame-based thinking, feeling, or relational responses with living more out of one's identity as a beloved, adopted son or daughter of God. These grace encounters will come through the formation practices of contemplative prayer, Scripture meditation, and spiritual friendships.

The success of my *entire* doctorate work will depend on adequate participation of GracePoint's people and friends from outside GracePoint in this small group. I am going to need at least 14 people (age 17 or older) to commit to participating in a small group, which will meet 2 hours a week for 10 consecutive weeks, probably Tuesday nights March 21—May 23, at a location to be determined, and then a one-day (possibly overnight) retreat probably the weekend of May 26.

The commitment will be to participate in every session, and will also include you taking 10-20 minutes a day in contemplative practices, meeting with me for spiritual direction at least three times, meeting with a same-gender spiritual friend from the small group at least 5 times, engaging in before and after assessments, and keeping a journal, which will be the quantitative and qualitative data of my thesis.

Please be in prayer now over whether our Lord will direct you to commit to this project. I suspect for all of us this commitment will require saying "no" to other things for 10 weeks. I will hold a gathering at GracePoint right after worship on February 19 from 11:45-12:15 to explain the purpose and vision of my doctorate thesis, and to explain exactly what participation in this small group will be like, so all can fully know what they are being asked to consider. I will then be asking for solid commitments by Wednesday, February 22. *Thank you!*

As much as any transformation can be guaranteed (as such is the work of the Holy Spirit), I can promise with confidence in *God's* faithfulness that those who participate in this small group will experience a milestone in your faith journey of healing, joy, freedom, intimacy with the Trinity, the Spirit's power to be the best possible *you* in Christ, and the fostering of life-giving soul care relationships.

Thank you all for all your prayers and support in this long, hard doctorate journey thus far, and thank you for prayerfully seeking the Lord regarding involvement in this small group.





Blood Drive Results

Witnessing Ministries of Christ

An inspiring memorial service for Rev. Philip Anand Prasad was held at the First Presbyterian Church in Fresno, California, on July 2, 2016. Below are Elizabeth's words.

Philip Prasad's life centered around the fact that his people, the Dalits (outcastes) of India, were in deep trouble. From the depths of his soul, he believed that they would find exodus from their oppression if they could know Jesus and learn to walk in His path. Philip was a man who acted decisively on this hope and who was undeterred by setbacks.

Though he is gone from us, all who knew him or knew about him

- gained an in-depth understanding of his people,
- observed his indigenous approach to mission,
- learned the importance for being at the grassroots level as needed, and
- saw how allowing people the freedom to exercise their responsibilities advanced the kingdom of God. His generosity and patience were enormous and many looking back realize how he lived his faith like few people do.

In his wake lives a new Exodus Presbyterian Church - India with land, infrastructure, and trained indigenous leaders who are building faith in families that have decided to be Christian. They are running schools dedicated to educating their children as high as they can go.

Our action can augment their efforts to grow their ministries and develop the backing they need within India to fully support themselves one day.



Smoke Detectors

GracePoint is dedicated to the safety of its members while using the church building. For that reason, the Property Team sought to install smoke detectors around the building. As a result, two members of the Dubuque Fire Department installed eight (8) smoke detectors in the narthex, main hall-way, stairwell, and lower level, including the stairway. The two firemen knew what the restrictions were and where to place the smoke alarms. These alarms are good for ten years and have a silencer and test button on them. They are to be discarded after ten years. The alarms are available for residential use, but the fire department included GracePoint in their program. The smoke alarms were provided free to our church. We thank the Fire Department for their donation and the installation of the alarms, which should provide increased safety and protection for our church.
